Reasons for urgency

Under the Licensing Act 2003, a standard temporary event notice may be submitted to the Licensing Authority and Police and Environmental Health responsible authorities no less than 10 working days prior to the first day on which the event takes place. Within 3 working days, the Police and Environmental Health responsible authorities may make an objection notice against the temporary event notice, and a panel hearing must then be held within 7 working days beginning with the day after the end of the period within which an objection notice may be given. Due to these short timescales this item has been put forward as urgent so as to comply with the Licensing Act 2003 and the regulations that accompany it.

Section 1: The Application

1.1 Temporary Event Notices have been given by the premises user for events to take place as described below.

Section 2: The Objection Notice

- 2.1 An objection notice was received from the Environmental Health responsible authority on the 20th January 2023. The objection notice is at **Appendix 3**.

Section 3: Licensing objectives (Chapter Four Pages 20-25 of the policy)

- 3.1 The objection notice was given because the responsible authority believe that the following licensing objectives will be undermined by the event:
- a) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Section 4: Recommendations

- 4.1 Members are advised to give consideration to the temporary event notice and the objection notice that have been submitted, and to this report.
- 4.2 Having considered the temporary event notice, the objection notice, the legislative provisions, and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State, Members have the following options:
- a) Allow the event to go ahead as set out in the Temporary Event Notice.
- b) Impose one or more conditions on the Temporary Event Notice as long as those conditions are for the promotion of the licensing objectives set out in paragraph 3.1, already exist on a premises licence for the relevant premises, and are consistent with the proposed licensable activity.
- c) If the licensing objectives in paragraph 3.1 are likely to be undermined a counter notice must be served on the premises user.
- 4.3 Members are reminded that all applications must be considered on their own merits, and that findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
