Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. The supply of alcohol is prohibited at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises.
2. The supply of alcohol is prohibited at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must
 - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.
5. But nothing in subsection (4) requires such a condition to be imposed -
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to -
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
6. For the purposes of this section
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies[and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act)], and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.
7. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.



(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

8. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
9. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or



- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
10. The responsible person must ensure that
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
11. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
12. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 11
- (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
- (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula
- $$P = D + (D \times V)$$
- where
- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and



(e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

13. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of 12 above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
14. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

15. All staff to receive regular training on the requirements of the four licensing objectives of the licensing Act 2003 with appropriate training records maintained.
16. CCTV shall be installed on the premises.
17. A challenge 25 policy shall operate on the premises.
18. Every supply of alcohol under this license will be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
19. CCTV shall be capable of holding recordings for 31 days and will be made available upon request to suitably authorised officers.
20. Drunk or violent persons will not be served or allowed in the premises.
21. The premises shall participate in local pub watch and have regular meetings with neighbours.
22. The premises will not carry out any irresponsible promotions.
23. The premises shall implement reasonable recommendations given by the Police and Licensing Authority.
24. The Challenge 25 policy shall be implemented on the premises.
25. The licence holder will ensure compliance of current fire and safety regulations.
26. Customers shall be asked to leave the premises promptly, quietly and respectfully.



27. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed at all exits asking customers to respect local residents and to leave quietly.
28. Staff will be trained regarding protection of children from harm.
29. No ID, No sale under the Challenge 25 will apply on the premises.
30. A refusal book and staff training records will be available on the premises at the request of the Police or Local Authority.
31. No vertical drinking at any time at the premises save for a maximum of 8 People if they are waiting for their table and for up to an hour. These customers will be served by a waiter/waitress service.
32. Orders for food and beverages shall be taken and dispensed by waiter or waitress service only.
33. Alcoholic beverages can only be sold to and consumed by customers outside the premises when sat at a table covered by a Tables and Chairs Licence where required.
34. No more than 10 customers shall be permitted to smoke outside the premises at any one time.
35. Regular litter and glass collections shall be carried out in all areas where customers are congregating
36. Vertical drinking allowed for up to 8 people whilst waiting for a table.
37. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder and violence
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol to include date, time, and staff member
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
 - (i) CAD reference numbers where Police are called.
38. A Challenge 25 policy will be enforced, where any person reasonably looking under the age of 25 shall be asked to prove their age when attempting to purchase alcohol and signs to this effect will be displayed at the premises. The only acceptable forms of identity will be those with photographic identification documents recognised in the Home Office guidance; including passports, photo-card driving licence or proof of age card bearing the PASS hologram"

**Annex 3 - Conditions attached after hearing by the licensing authority
(Hearing date: 30/06/2016)**

Conditions agreed with the Police

39. The CCTV system shall be maintained in good working order and at all times the premises is open to the public, be fully operational covering both internal and external areas of the premises to which the public have access.
40. The CCTV camera views are not to be obstructed.
41. At least one CCTV camera is to be placed no more than seven feet above floor level; near to the exit in order to capture clear facial images of all persons leaving the premises.
42. At all times when the premises are open for the purposes of licensable activities, a suitably trained member of staff shall be present to assist the Police or an authorised officer in obtaining the CCTV footage.
43. Copies shall be made available within 48 hours to the Police or Local Authority, upon request
44. The facility to transfer the images to a compatible, removable format, shall be held on the premises.
45. Staff working at the premises shall be trained in the use of CCTV and a log will be kept to verify this.
46. Signs must be displayed in the customer areas to advise that CCTV is in operation.
47. The venue shall supply, and fit, suitable anti-theft devices, such as table/counter clips, in order that customers may secure their bags.
48. At least one member of the management team on duty whilst the premises remain open for licensable activities, is to hold a personal license under the Licensing Act 2003
49. The venue must employ and document a dispersal policy to the satisfaction of the Police and Licensing Authority, for the patrons leaving the venue at the end of an event. These documents must be made available on request to any responsible authority and be reviewed on a monthly basis.
50. A comprehensive staff training programme is to be put together which will cover the Licensing Act 2003: Fire evacuation procedures, Critical Incident best-practice, crime scene best practice. This training is to be clearly documented and any training for future staff must also be organised at the appropriate time.



Training shall be written into a programme of going review and will be made available for inspection by Police or other responsible authority, upon request.

51. No persons carrying visibly open or sealed alcohol vessels shall be admitted to the premises at any time that the premises are open for any licensable activity.
52. The venue shall not engage the services of street promoters to encourage clientele to attend the venue.
53. Regular glass collection shall be undertaken by staff.
54. Police must be called to incidents of violence and/or disorder.
55. No sound emanating from the premises to be audible between 2300 hours and 0800 hours.
56. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
57. No lagers or ciders in cans or plastic bottles over 5.5% ABV to be sold or stored on the premises.
58. No white cider products above 5.5% ABV to be sold or stored on the premises.
59. A personal licence holder to be present at the venue at all times when the venue is open during licensed hours.
60. The Premises Licence Holder and/or Designated Premises Supervisor shall not purchase any alcohol goods from door to door sellers.
61. The Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Licence Holder shall ensure alcohol is only purchased from an authorised wholesaler and shall produce receipts for the same upon request for inspection. (An authorised wholesaler means an established warehouse or trade outlet with a fixed address and not a van or street trader, even if they claim they are part of, or acting on behalf of, an authorised wholesaler who provides full itemised VAT receipts).
62. The Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure persons responsible for purchasing alcohol do not take part in any stock swaps or lend or borrow any alcohol goods from any other source unless the source is another venue owned and operated by the same company who also purchase their stock from an authorised wholesaler.
63. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure all receipts for alcohol goods purchased include the following details:
 - I. Seller's name and address
 - II. Seller's company details, if applicable
 - III. Seller's VAT details, if applicable
 - IV. Vehicle registration detail, if applicable



64. Legible copies of the documents referred to in Condition 63 above shall be retained on the premises and made available for inspection by Police and authorised Council Officers on request.
65. Copies of the documents referred to in Condition 63 above shall be retained on the premises for period of not less than twelve months.
66. Where the trader becomes aware that any alcohol may be not duty paid they shall inform the Police of this immediately.

Officer conditions consistent with the operating schedule

67. CCTV is installed and operated at the premises and data is saved for 31days.
68. A staff member who is familiar with the CCTV system will be on duty at all times the premises are open.
69. Staff are trained to refuse alcohol sales to drunk or violent people.
70. The DPS and the Premises Licence Holder will attend pub watch meetings and any local neighbourhood watch meetings.
71. There will be no irresponsible sales promotions at the premises.
72. Deliveries will take place within the recommended times suggested by the authorities.
73. Staff will clean any rubbish or littering in front of the premises during the day on a regular basis.
74. Staff will be trained regarding the protection of children from harm.
75. A challenge 25 policy will be in operation. No Proof No sale signs and posters will be on display.
76. A refusals book will be kept and maintained at the premises.
77. Staff will have regular refresher courses regarding the four licensing objectives.

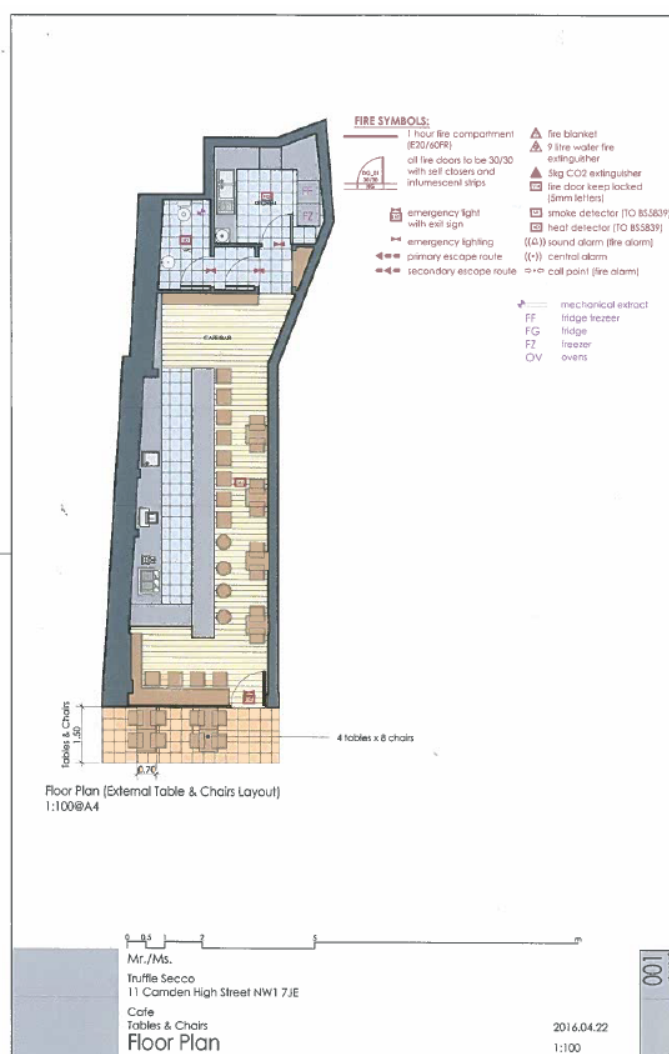
78. Off sales of wine only are permitted within the venue between the hours of 10:00-22:00 hours.
79. Sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be sold in sealed containers; with the exception for customers who are dining on the premises and may not want to finish a bottle of wine where the cork or cap has been released.
80. No patron shall be permitted to leave the premises whilst in possession of any open vessels of alcohol at any time. Save for condition 78.

81. Customers who are placing an order for home delivery may include alcohol with food when a substantial meal has been ordered with it.

Section 1: Background comments of the Head of Legal Services

- 1.1 Members should only address those matters that have formed the subject matter of the objection notice. Matters that arise that are not the subject of the objection notice fall outside the function that the Panel is exercising when it holds a hearing
- 1.2 Members must determine, having regard for the evidence, whether not giving a counter notice will impact adversely on crime and disorder licensing objective.
- 1.3 In accordance with the provisions of Part 3 of Schedule 5 of the Act, where a Licensing Authority gives a counter notice, the premises user may appeal against the decision, to a magistrate's court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.4 Similarly, the Police may appeal against a decision not to give the premises user a counter notice. Any such appeal must be made to a magistrates court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.5 The Human Rights Act 1998 incorporates the key articles of the European Convention on Human Rights into domestic law. Decisions on licensing matters are actions of a public authority and must be compatible with Convention rights. Consequently Members of the Panel must be aware of the rights contained in the Convention (particularly those set out below) when making licensing decisions.

(a) Article 6: Right to a fair trial

In the determination of his civil rights and obligations, everyone is entitled to a fair and public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law.

(b) Article 8: Right to respect for private and family life

Everyone has a right to respect for his or her private life, his home and correspondence.

(c) Article 1 of the First Protocol: Protection of property

Every natural or legal person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions, including a licence. No one shall be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and subject to the conditions provided for by law and by the general principles of international law.

(d) Article 10: Freedom of Expression

Everyone has the right to freedom of expression. This right shall include freedom to hold opinions and to receive and impart information and ideas without interference by public authority and regardless of frontiers. This Article shall not prevent States from requiring the licensing of broadcasting, television or cinema enterprises.

The exercise of these freedoms since it carries with it duties and responsibilities may be subject to such formalities, conditions, restrictions or penalties as are prescribed by law and are necessary in a democratic society, in the interests of national security, territorial integrity or public safety, for the prevention of disorder or crime, for the protection of health and morals, for the protection of the reputation or rights of others, for preventing the disclosure of information received in confidence, or for maintaining the authority and impartiality of the judiciary.

(e) Article 14: Prohibition of discrimination

The enjoyment of the rights and freedoms set forth in this Convention shall be secured without discrimination on any ground such as sex, race, colour, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, association with a national minority, property, birth, or other status.
