

## Appendix F: Glossary of abbreviations and terms used in SPP 2023

A	<b>Actual</b> ; relating to real numbers that have been recorded i.e. <u>actual</u> school rolls from the school census, or <u>actual</u> registered births etc.
AHS	<b>Average Household Size</b> ; relating to GLA population projections and the average number of persons residing in a household.
AN	<b>Admission Number</b> ; relating to school admission numbers, and the number of pupils in a school or planned admission numbers (see below).
BBC	<b>British Broadcasting Corporation</b> ; is the British public service broadcaster, the world's oldest national broadcasting organisation.
BREXIT	<b>British Exit from the European Union</b> ; the withdrawal of the United Kingdom from the European Union.
BSF	<b>Building Schools for the Future</b> ; historic reference to the previous Labour government education investment programme in secondary school buildings in England in the 2000's.
CIP	<b>Community Investment Programme</b> ; is the Camden 15-year plan to invest money in schools, homes and community facilities.
CL	<b>Camden Learning</b> ; is a relatively new education partnership created for the benefit of children and schools. It enables local schools, which are members of <b>Camden Learning</b> , to work together for the good of their pupils – sharing expertise in teaching and learning to drive improvement across the borough.
DfE	<b>Department for Education</b> ; a department of the UK Government responsible for child protection, education (compulsory, further and higher education), apprenticeships and wider skills in England.
DSG	<b>Dedicated Schools Grant</b> ; is a ring-fenced grant of which the majority is used to fund individual school budgets in maintained schools, academies and free schools.
ESFA	<b>Education and Skills Funding Agency</b> ; the ESFA brings together the former responsibilities of the Education Funding Agency (EFA) and Skills Funding Agency (SFA) to create a single agency accountable for funding education and skills for children, young people and adults. ESFA is an executive agency, sponsored by the Department for Education.
EU	<b>European Union</b> : an economic and political partnership between 27 countries now excluding the UK following its departure. The EU is the most recent form of European integration, within which the single market allows goods, capital, services and people to move freely across the national borders of the member states.
FE	<b>Forms of Entry</b> ; representing school places in schools i.e.1FE equals 30 school places, 2FE equals 60 school places etc.
GLA	<b>Greater London Authority</b> ; the regional government of Greater London, consisting of a Mayor of London (currently Sadiq Khan), the head of the executive body, and a London Assembly, the scrutinising chamber.
GP	<b>General Practitioner</b> ; a doctor based in the community who treats patients with minor or chronic illnesses and refers those with serious conditions to a hospital (Camden receives numbers of those on GP registers in the borough).
ILEA	<b>Inner London Education Authority</b> ; historic reference for an ad hoc local education authority for the City of London and the 12 Inner London boroughs (including Camden) from 1965 until its abolition in 1990.

ISOS	<b>ISOS Partnership</b> ; is an independent research and consultancy organisation which specialises in education and Children's Services and supports clients in both local and national government.
LA	<b>Local Authority</b> ; an administrative body in local government.
LaSWAP	<b>LaSWAP</b> ; is a unique sixth form consortium comprising four small but closely linked sixth forms that all work together to create a distinctive 'campus' feel. Schools include; <b>La Sainte Union, William Ellis, Acland Burghley, and Parliament Hill.</b>
LC	<b>London Councils</b> ; is the local government association for Greater London. It is a cross-party organisation that represents London's 32 borough councils and the City of London. It was formed in 1995 as a merger of the London Boroughs Association and the Association of London Authorities.
LEA	<b>Local Education Authority</b> ; (in England and Wales) a council body responsible for administering education in a particular area.
LGA	<b>Local Government Association</b> ; is an organisation which comprises local authorities in England and Wales. The LGA seeks to promote better local government, it maintains communication between officers in different local authorities to develop best practice.
LGBCE	<b>Local Government Boundary Commission for England</b> ; is responsible for conducting reviews of local authority electoral arrangements, through an 'electoral review'. They can also conduct reviews of the structure of local government, and the external boundaries of local authorities i.e. wards.
MHCLG	<b>Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government</b> ; (MHCLG or MoHoCoLoGo) is the UK Government department for housing, communities and local government in England. It was established in May 2006 and is the successor to the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister, established in 2001/ <b>DCLG</b> , Department of Communities and Local Government.
MYE	<b>Mid-Year Estimates (ONS)</b> ; Mid-year population estimates are the official source of population sizes in-between censuses, covering populations of local authorities, counties, regions and countries of the UK by age and sex.
NC	<b>Net Capacity</b> ; sets out the total number of pupils that a school can admit based on its available teaching space.
NHS	<b>National Health Service</b> ; Government-funded medical and health care services that everyone living in the UK can use without being asked to pay the full cost of the service.
NPD	<b>National Pupil Database</b> ; a database controlled by the Department for Education, based on multiple data collections from individuals in state funded education in England.
OFSTED	<b>Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills</b> . Inspect services providing education and skills for learners of all ages. inspect and regulate services that care for children and young people.
ONS	<b>Office for National Statistics</b> ; the UK's largest independent producer of official statistics, and the recognised national statistical institute of the UK. It is responsible for collecting and publishing statistics related to the economy, population and society at; national, regional, and local levels.
P	<b>Projection</b> ; an estimate or forecast of a future situation based on a study of present trends i.e. GLA population or school roll projection etc.
PA	<b>Planning Area</b> ; used in Camden for primary school place planning purposes only, based on a combination of wards, there are five planning areas in Camden.

PAN	<b>Planned Admission Number</b> ; the number of pupils in each age group a school will admit each year.
PP	<b>Population Projections</b> ; GLA demographic population projections, estimates of the size and characteristics of the future resident population of Camden/London. <u>In 2021: GLA 2019-BPP (2021)</u> .
PSBP	<b>Priority Schools Building Programme</b> ; a UK government programme rebuilding and refurbishing school buildings in the worst condition across the country.
SCAP	<b>School Capacity Survey (SCAP)</b> ; a statutory data collection all local authorities are required to complete every year for the ESFA/DfE.
SEND	<b>Special Educational Needs and Disability</b> ; all schools have a duty to be accessible and inclusive for the children within their community.
SER	<b>South of the Euston Road</b> ; an area in the southern part of Camden south of the Euston road, and comprising of three wards; Bloomsbury, Holborn & Covent Garden, King's Cross. It is also an historic campaign reference for a school SER in Camden, now called; ' <b>The Holborn School Campaign</b> ' (THSC).
SHLAA	<b>Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (GLA projections)</b> ; a Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA) is a technical exercise to determine the quantity and suitability of land potentially available for housing development, GLA produce a set of population projections based on this information.
SPP	<b>School Places Planning</b> ; reviewing past and current trends using a range of latest available data and information, to determine future school need or surplus.
SRP	<b>School Roll Projections</b> ; the GLA SRP projection model creates school roll projections based on the GLA population projections of the home wards of pupils at each school. <u>In 2021: GLA SRP 2021</u> .
SSIN	<b>Social Infrastructure Needs</b> ; broadly defined as the construction and maintenance of facilities that support social services, housing development reference.
TFR	<b>Total Fertility Rate (ONS)</b> ; is defined as, "the average number of children a women would have assuming that current age-specific birth rates remain constant throughout childbearing years.
THSC	<b>The Holborn School Campaign</b> ; local Camden south of the Euston road community campaigning for a school south of the Euston road.
UCL	<b>University College London</b> ; is a public research university in London.
UK	<b>United Kingdom</b> ; comprised of four nations of; England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
