

Arlington Road Area Low Traffic Neighbourhood - Scheme Amendments

Overview

The Covid-19 pandemic has changed how people in Camden live, travel and work. Since the start of the pandemic many of us have been spending more time closer to home, making our neighbourhoods more important than ever. We want our streets to **be safe spaces** for you to walk and cycle, **for children to get to and from school safely and healthily**, for **businesses to be able to flourish** and for **you to be breathing cleaner air**.

As 69% of households in Camden do not own a car and public transport capacity remains much lower than before the pandemic, we know that safe and easy walking, cycling and scooting routes are more important than ever. Supporting and encouraging those who are able to walk and cycle, by creating safer streets will ensure that there is more space available on public transport and on our roads for those who need it the most.

Why we are consulting

We have recently made changes to the streets west of Camden High Street, from Mornington Crescent to Camden Town, to make them safer for pedestrians, people with mobility scooters or wheelchairs, children and those who cycle. We also made a change on Buck Street which lies to the east of Camden High Street. These changes have been delivered as a package as the Arlington Road Area Low Traffic Neighbourhood. The changes have been designed to significantly reduce the number of vehicles using these residential streets to cut through between main roads while enabling access for local people. 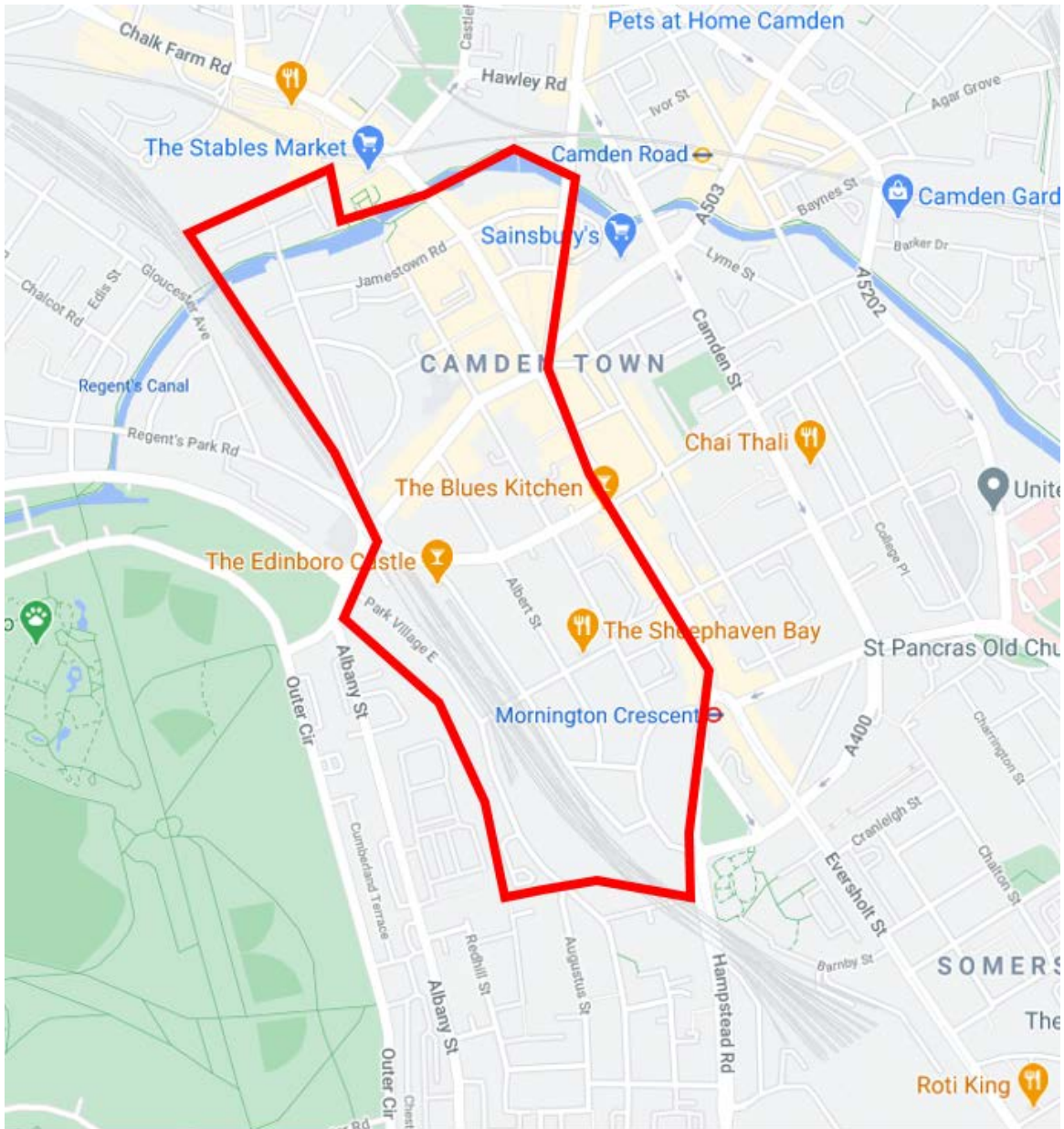
We now want to make a number of amendments in [the area](#), in response to feedback received via email, on our online Commonplace website, via direct contact with residents and site visits conducted by Camden Officers, so that the Arlington Road Area Low Traffic Neighbourhood will work better for local people.

In line with new Department for Transport guidance, we are now consulting on all new, or amendments to existing Safe and Healthy Street schemes so that we can engage our local residents, businesses and stakeholders in changes happening on their streets. We want to know what you think about these additional proposals.

Proposed Changes to Inverness Street

This scheme will prohibit access to Arlington Road from Inverness Street for general motor vehicle traffic and will restrict the through-traffic using Gloucester Crescent and Inverness Street to access Arlington Road and Parkway. Emergency service vehicles will be allowed to pass through the restriction. Access into Inverness Street from Arlington Road will not be affected.

Mornington Place

We are proposing to make changes to Mornington Place including:

Removing the existing measure on Mornington Place junction with Mornington Crescent and **replace** it with a motor vehicle access restriction at the junction of Mornington Place with Clarkson Row/Mornington Terrace. This new scheme will prohibit motor vehicle movements into and out of Mornington Place at the junction with Clarkson Row/Mornington Terrace and will restrict through-traffic using Mornington Place to access Delancey Street from Hampstead Road.

Reinstate 2 resident parking spaces on Mornington Place

Convert 3 existing 'Paid for' parking spaces to 'Shared' parking spaces, so that both permit holders in the CPZ zone and those seeking to use 'pay by phone' parking bays can use these spaces to park

Introduce 1 'Shared' use parking space on Mornington Place to balance the demand for resident parking spaces with this for paid for space for visitors to the area.

Parking changes

We are also proposing to make parking amendments to Arlington Road, Albert Street and Mornington Street to balance demand for resident parking spaces with paid for parking spaces for visitors to the area. This includes:

- Conversion of **5** parking spaces on the east side of Arlington Road, between Delancey St and Mornington St, from 'Paid for' parking to 'Shared use' parking spaces for Resident Permit Parking holders and Paid for Parking.
- Conversion of **4** parking spaces on Albert St, south of Delancey St, from 'Paid for' to 'Shared' parking spaces for Resident Permit Parking holders and Paid for Parking.
- Conversion of **6** parking spaces on the south side of Mornington Street, from 'Paid for' to 'Shared use' parking spaces for Resident Permit Parking holders and Paid for Parking.
